Ms. Miller has served in a variety of executive positions throughout the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel Policy. During her tenure,

She provided oversight to the 14th Quadrennial Review of Military Compensation and led the implementation of Flexible Spending Accounts for Service members and military families.

Ms. Miller previously served as a Special Assistant to both Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel and Ashton Carter where she was responsible for a broad spectrum of programs to include Military and Civilian Personnel Policy, Military Force Readiness, Defense Health Affairs, Reserve Affairs, Defense Sexual Assault Prevention and Response, and interagency cooperation with Veterans Affairs. Her career includes leadership positions within the Department of the Navy and as a Defense Legislative Fellow.

Ms. Miller graduated from Villanova University with a degree in English Literature and Business Administration, and received her commission from the Navy ROTC program, subsequently serving as a Surface Warfare Officer in support of Operations Iraqi and Enduring Freedom. She received her graduate degree in Human Resources Development and Adult Education from The George Washington University. Ms. Miller's contributions to the Department of Defense have been recognized with the Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Civilian Service (DCS) in 2015, the Presidential Rank Award for Meritorious Executive Service in 2021, and a DCS Bronze Palm in 2025.
