
SUBJECT: Fiscal Year 2011 Status of Drug Use in the Department of Defense Personnel

The *Fiscal Year 2011 Status of Drug Use in the Department of Defense Personnel* report is attached for your information. This report is a compilation of over five million Service member and Department of Defense (DoD) civilian drug analyses conducted at the six DoD drug testing laboratories.

For Fiscal Year 2011, the Department maintained an overall illicit drug positive rate below the two percent goal. However, several Service component "high risk" populations had drug positive rates in excess of two percent. This is significant in the fact that the "high risk" population comprises only 35 percent of the force, but accounts for 66 percent of overall positive specimens.

We are also providing additional data such as unit identification code, short name, location, and testing frequency of those units with a drug positive rate above the DoD goal of two percent. Commanders can use these data to assess the effectiveness of their drug testing programs by pinpointing where drug use poses the greatest threat to readiness. These data will also allow the opportunity to develop anti-drug programs and training initiatives in order to reduce drug use and increase frequency of testing where necessary.
